**C. Other hazards not included in the hazard category criteria (e.g. dust explosion hazard)**

Potential routes of exposure to this product are skin and eye contact, ingestion, and inhalation.

Diphenyl (2,4,6-trimethylbenzoyl) phosphineoxide - In animal testing, risk of impaired fertility was shown only after repeated ingestion of very high doses of this substance.

Carbon black is classified by the IARC as a Group 2B carcinogen (the substance is possibly carcinogenic to humans). Carbon black in this preparation, due to its bound form, does not present this carcinogenic risk. None of the other ingredients in this preparation are classified as carcinogens according to ACGIH, EU, IARC, MAK, NTP or OSHA.

Carbon black is present only in a bound form in this preparation.

**4. First aid measures**

**A. In case of eye contact**

In their evaluations of carbon black, both organizations indicate that exposure to carbon black, per se, does not occur when it remains bound within a product matrix, specifically, rubber, ink, or paint. Carbon black is present only in a bound form in this preparation. Based on available data, the classification criteria are not met.

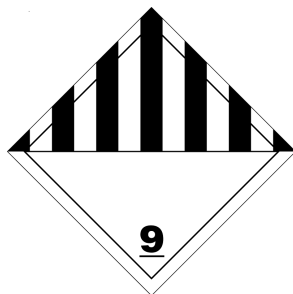

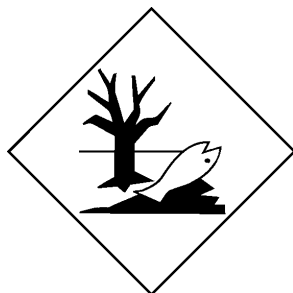
